## Labs2Zero Partnership

If you are looking for additional ways to get involved with I2SL, consider becoming a Labs2Zero Owner Partner. Both public and private research institutions and real estate organizations that own labs are eligible to become Labs2Zero partners at no cost to the organization. The only requirement to becoming a partner is agreeing to provide data, by either entering energy and building information through the I2SL Laboratory Benchmarking Tool (LBT) on an annual basis, or by providing embodied emissions data supporting the development of an Embodied Carbon Benchmarking tool for labs. In either case, buildings' data are anonymized, so facilities and their locations will not be identifiable to other LBT users or the public.
